

Patient's Name: Mr. Jeet Bahadur Age: 55 Diagnosis: CA Mandible Cancer of the mandible

Patient Jeet Bahadur was admitted on February 02, 2010, to the hospice. When he came to us he was in terrible pain, and a foul

smell was coming from his wound. After talking to him, we came to know that he had been living in Vrindavan for the last 15 years, didn't have family, and had been out of his job for the past year. At first, his fellow mates were helping him finance his treatment. But after some time they could not afford it, so finally Mr. Jeet Bahadur came to us, hoping that we could take care of his pain and wound. We gave him medicine for his pain and dressed his wound. He stayed at the hospice for five months and was very happy with the service provided. He considered the hospice team as his family and the hospice as his home. Many times he would bring sweets for all the employees.

He was very softhearted and good-natured, and he used to help other patients, and saw many of them die. His wound was getting bigger and bigger, emanating a foul smell, but our staff took very good care of him, and on the 10th of October 2010 he passed away very peacefully. Whenever our staff members look at the bed he occupied for many months, they miss him.



DETAILS OF FACILITIES



Facilities at Bhaktivedanta Hospice

- Spread over an area of 40,000 square feet
- · 8 single-patient rooms with heating and air-conditioning
- 6 double- and triple-patient rooms, air-cooled
- Massage facilities / TENS machine
- Temple and prayer hall
- Mobile temple
- Outpatient clinic
- Generator
- Garden with Vrindavan theme

Facilities in Patient Rooms

- Each room covers 575 sq. ft., has two windows and one French window
- Automatic patient bed
- · Bathroom that accommodates entire bed
- · Writing table with chair
- Small altar
- Bed for attendant
- · Chairs and sofas for visitors
- Large storage area for personal belongings
- Intercom, nurse call-bell, Internet connection
- Pantry
- Reverse osmosis drinking water, softened water for other uses
- Audio system with one channel for kirtan and Srila Prabhupada lectures and one channel for live ISKCON temple classes.

MESSAGES



Mr. Khagan Singh, a 72-year-old man from Maanth village, came to our hospice on 11th October 2010. He was diagnosed with cancer of the neck. He was in pain, couldn't swallow properly, suffered from breathless insomnia, and he was not able to talk. Our palliative physician, Dr. Avnish Panday, examined the patient and started the medication

immediately. Thereafter, the patient got relief from his pain, and he started talking. Our nursing staff then found out from him that he had a wife and a son in Kolkata, but he had been living in Maanth village for the last four years, doing 'Goseva'.

One day when the patient was busy in his work, he felt a sudden pain in his neck. He went to three or four doctors, but couldn't get relief. Finally he came to know about our hospice.

Later, he told us: "I have no relatives here with me, but the love and care which I get from you at this place makes me happier than being with my family members. I don't miss anyone since I came here."



Patient Nageena, a 36-years-old woman from Vrindavan, came to our hospice on 13th March 2010 with cancer of the colon. When she arrived at the hospice, she had a burning pain and wound in the abdomen. Our palliative physician admitted the patient and put her on medication.

The patient informed us that she had first gone to a general surgeon in Mathura. The surgeon had prescribed some medicines for a month, but she got no relief. So she went to an ayurvedic doctor who advised her to do a USG. In her USG report she was diagnosed with CA COLON. The patient then went to the Pushpanjali Hospital in Agra for an operation. She got relief for one and a half years. But now the same problem has reoccurred. She had spent almost 2 or 3 lakhs in the treatment without tangible results. Finally she came to hear about our hospice and got relief from her pain and wound.

She has three sons and two daughters and wants to get her elder daughter married, but she has very little money. But due to our staff's comforting care, she is happy and relieved from her problems.
